


Sergeant Bob Brooker left the island on Tuesday for a few weeks leave in the United

IRISH WIN AGAIN

The All Island Major Units and United Nations Cross Country Championships were held at the Royal Air Force Happy Valley Course, Episkopi, on Wednesday 21st January.

From the beginning the familiar battle between the leading runners O'Sullivan (IRCON), Ferguson, Stennett (RAF) and Nelson (3rd Royal Anglian Regiment) took place. However, halfway up the mountain on the first lap, O'Sullivan broke clear and steadily increased his lead to come home a very comfortable winner. His time of 48.04 minutes set a new course record.

This was Sergeant O'Sullivan's second gold medal award in the space of three weeks, he previously was first individual in the annual 3½ mile Happy Valley hill climb on 7th January.

O'Sullivan also led IRCON to win the team award for the United Nations Championship and this placed them third in the All Island Race, behind Akrotiri 'A' and Episkopi.

Seven teams competed in the race and there were 58 competitors. IRCON packed their scoring eight into the first 26 runners home. Sergeant O'Sullivan (1), Sergeant M. Byrne (11), Private J. Crowley (16), Corporal J. Cooper (18), Private P. Nash (19), Private J. Gagan (22), Corporal J. Keating (25) and Lieutenant J. J. Moriarty (26).





Week: IMPROPER DRIVING

Speeding does not necessarily mean exceeding the speed limit. Police records show that 'Speed Too Fast For Road And Traffic Conditions' ranks second as being the largest contributor to the causes of all accidents.

Since this offence is one of the most predominant causes, drivers are urged to reduce their speed by five to ten MPH under the authorized limit.

This speed would conform with the type of roads and unfamiliar

conditions which we encounter in this country.

As a general rule, a driver must always maintain a speed that enables him to have complete control of his vehicle at all times.

RUGBY**United Nations v Argonauts**

The newly formed United Nations Rugby Team, captained by Lieutenant Whitehead, Royal Anglian Regiment, were again successful, slamming the Royal Air Force Argonauts 24 to 6 at Akrotiri last Saturday.
